Bill Gould—an architect and planner—worked with councilman Joe Cimperman to do something that sounds boring, but which has deep impact on Cleveland’s appeal to artists—especially those who would like to tap into the rust belt’s famous industrial-scale space. In 2001, the Goulds and the councilman created the “Live-

Work overlay” to the city’s zoning code. The legislation allows artists to live and work within specified boundaries in the industrial buildings on the near-east side.

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
